

## **DISEC**

The delegation of China opens up the first session with the common purpose of coming up with a definition for the term “terrorism” in order to use in the committee so that a solution can be rapidly reached. Various existing definitions of terrorism were pointed out, such as the one given by the European Nation and by the United Nations, and came to the conclusion that terrorism is an act against a state and society, and additionally causes social panic.

During the second session, the definition of terrorism was still being debated, as well as the military action taken by the U.S in Syria the past week. The delegation of Iran stated that the United States was the reason for the crisis presented on day one and that they should be condemned, and was backed up by delegations such as the People’s Republic of China, the ambassador of Russia and Syria. On the other hand, delegations such as the ambassador of the United Kingdom backed up the actions taken by the United States justifying the use of chemical weapons in Syria.

The debate was then focused on how to create a better international gun control. Topics such as regulation of systems of arms manufacturers, managing of stockpiles, access to international control systems, control over sales, access to databases of gun buyers, increase of cost of guns were suggested by the delegations of Iran, China, Syria and the United Kingdom.

The directive number two created a spark between the delegations of the United States, France, United Kingdom and Iran. Finally, the directive four announced the creation of a new counter terrorism group with the United Kingdom and France, action that was called “irrational” by various delegates. The Turkish group PYD got financial support form the United States to fight against ISIS and the United States, France and the United Kingdom all agreed to temporarily stop bombing Syria.
