Thursday, April 19th 2018.

The day started with a moderated caucus for 20 minutes. The chair made sure that the delegates had some important aspects completely clear, such as interventionism and sovereignty. Then the delegates met in a lobby time to discuss their positions about the situation. The United States clearly stated that they were not going to negotiate with terrorists while Russia proposes to send a humanitarian process so that they can help people who are injured. Iran says that if in two hours the United States does nothing, they will close the channel where they are sending oil. The United Kingdom affirmed that neither Russia nor China want a military improvement. France intervenes and says that what they seek is not revenge, what they seek is justice. They are willing to send a check which can help people who are injured. Sudan says that it has no meaning or coherence that the United Kingdom wants peace. The second directive arrived saying that Iran had closed the channel which the United States was using. Then came the director of the red cross: Yves Daccord and told them she was impressed that this committee is focused on lists and definitions when they could be doing many things which can save people who are injured. They started an unmoderated caucus for 8 minutes so they can discuss what they want to do and start generating solutions instead of attacking each other.
